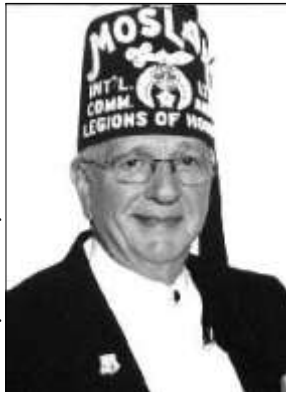

ARTICLE III

Section 3. ARLINGTON WREATH LAYING CEREMONY AT THE TOMB OF THE UNKNOWN

(A) Purpose of the event is to honor those who paid the supreme sacrifice.

(B) The purpose of the Honor Guard is to insure an unobstructed path for the International Commander as he lays a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown.
