Proper Display of National Flags

Shriners International, as its name states, is an international fraternal organization. As such, all flags are to be displayed in accordance with the proper protocol of the nation, commonwealth or territory of the Jurisdiction in which the parades, functions and meetings are being held. In some countries or jurisdictions, such as the United States of America, the position on the right is the position of honor. In other countries or jurisdictions a different protocol may prevail.

Buildings. Flags may be displayed inside and outside of appropriate buildings. If only one flag is displayed, it must be the flag of the country or jurisdiction. It is acceptable to fly flags of all countries wherein a Shrine temple exists as long as they are of similar size and height. It is also acceptable to fly additional flags such as state and provincial flags, Shriners International flag, Shriners Hospitals for Children's flag, and the temple flag.

At Shriners International headquarters, the flags of the United States and Canada are to be flown at all times. The flags of other coun-

tries or jurisdictions having Shrine temples are to be displayed on a rotating basis for a period of one month.

In an Auditorium. Once again, the protocol of the country or jurisdiction will prevail. In the United States of America, when used on a speaker's platform, the flag, if displayed flat, should be displayed above and behind the speaker; and when it is displayed from a staff in a church or public auditorium it should be displayed at the speaker or clergyman's right as he faces the audience or congregation; and other flags should be on the left of the speaker or clergyman. However, if it is a Shrine function, it would be proper to have the flags of other Shrine countries or jurisdictions at the speaker's right (next to the American flag) in the order of their charter dates; and any other flags at the speaker are left.

Of course, if the Shrine event is being held in another country or jurisdiction, the position of honor for a flag on a staff would be reserved for the flag of the country or jurisdiction at the speaker's right as he faces the audience, and the flags of other Shrine countries or jurisdic-

tions at the speaker's right (next to the host country or jurisdiction flag) in the order of their charter dates; and any other flags at the speaker's left.

At Parades. Once again, the protocol of the country or jurisdiction will prevail. In some countries or jurisdictions, when in procession, the flag of the country or jurisdiction may be either on the marching right, that is, the flag's own right or, if there are a great number of other flags, it may be in front of the center of that line. If not inconsistent with protocol, it is recommended that the national flags be paraded side by side and in front of state, provincial, and other local flags, with the flag of the country or jurisdiction having the position of honor on the marching right.

Other flags which temples may wish to parade should be in a line immediately following the national flags in the following order, beginning on the right: state or provincial flag; Shrine temple flag; Imperial Potentate's flag; Past Imperial Potentates' flags, and other flags.

One of the most common violations of international flag usage is the dipping of national flags at reviewing stands, during the playing of the national anthems and other occasions. Unless the protocol of the country or jurisdiction states otherwise, national flags should never be dipped to any person or thing. However, all other flags should be dipped as a mark of honor.

In Front of Shrine Temples and Club Buildings. When national flags are dis-

played in front of a Shrine temple or Shrine club building, they should be flown from separate staffs at the same height and the flags should be of approximately equal size. The flag of the country or jurisdiction in which they are being displayed should be in the position of honor in accordance with the country or jurisdiction's protocol. In the United States of America, this is the extreme right, i.e., a person's own right as he faces outward of the building's entrance.

Half Staff. When a country or jurisdiction in

which the flags are displayed proclaims that its flag should be flown at half-staff, it would improper to fly the other flags at full staff. Therefore, the flags of the other country or jurisdictions should not be flown during that period.

Order of Charter Dates. The order is as follows: United States of America, Canada, Mexico, Panama, Puerto Rico, Philippines and Germany.

Proposed Bylaws Amendments for 2012 Convention

The International Bylaws Committee has received three proposed amendments to the Association's Bylaws for consideration at the 2012 IALOH Convention.

- 1) From El Hasa Legion of Honor: A change redefining the Annual Meeting.
- 2) From Boumi Legion of Honor: A change affecting submission and approval of IALOH Convention Budgets.
- 3) From Zem Zem Legion of Honor: A change defining membership eligibility of World War II Merchant Marines.

These proposals were reviewed by the

Committee and the International Judge Advocate. The Judge Advocate's rulings follow:

The proposed bylaws amendments submitted by El Hasa Legion of Honor and Boumi Legion of Honor are in proper form and should be presented to the membership at the convention in March for a vote.

The proposed bylaws amendment submitted by Zem Zem Legion of Honor is not in the proper form, it contains extraneous material, and its intent to allow Merchant Marines who served in World War II and were declared Veterans to become members of the Legion of Honor is superfluous because

our Association Bylaws already state that any Shriner who has served in the Armed Forces of his country and has received an Honorable Discharge or release from active duty and received a Form DD214 is eligible to become a member of the Legion of Honor. Veteran status was granted to most World War II mariners on January 19, 1988, after a court case and reconsideration by the Civilian Military Review Board.

In accordance with Article IX of the Association Bylaws, the proposals submitted by El Hasa and Boumi Legions of Honor are presented below for review.

EL HASA PROPOSAL

Article III, Section 1, International Annual Meeting. Currently reads: The International Association Legions of Honor Annual Meeting shall be held at the same time and place as the Imperial Session is held each year. The International Commander shall request the Legion of Honor Unit in that city where the annual meeting is to be held to make arrangements for a suitable meeting place and those refreshments he wishes to have available. The International Commander shall set the time and date for this meeting. If there is not a chartered Legion of Honor Unit in that

city, the International Commander shall select another Legion of Honor Unit to host and make all the required arrangements. The International Association Legions of Honor Finance Committee shall designate a fixed sum in the budget to defray the expenses incurred by the host Unit for the Annual Meeting. All official business of the International Association Legions of Honor shall be included at the convention.

Proposed Change: Delete entire paragraph and add the following to read:

Article III, Section 1. The International Association Legions of Honor Annual

Meeting shall be held at the same time and place as the International Association Legions of Honor Convention.

Rationale: Many Legion of Honor members, including members of the Board of Directors are unable to attend the Imperial Session. Some of those that do, have other responsibilities and are unable to attend the Legion of Honor meeting. Conducting the International Association Legions of Honor Meeting at the same time and place as the International Association Legions of Honor Annual Convention, will permit all business to be conducted at one meeting and eliminate an expensive trip for many.

BOUMI PROPOSAL

The underlined and *italicized* wording is to be deleted, **bold print** is new or revised verbiage.

Article III, Section 2, subdivision (A):

...The budget for the International Association Legions of Honor Convention is and shall be an integral part of the Fiscal Budget for the I.A.L.O.H., which commences at the conclusion of the preceding Convention. The contract for the hotel to be utilized for our Convention must be submitted and approved at least two (2) years prior to said convention. The Convention Budget shall be presented and approved at the Arlington Meeting in November of the year prior to the

commencement of the Fiscal Year. The Convention Budget shall be presented and approved by the International Board of Directors at the Arlington Meeting in November of the year prior to the commencement of the Fiscal Year in which the convention takes place. A copy of both of these Budgets will be sent shall be forwarded to each unit at least two (2) months prior to the convening of the convention at which they will presented for a vote.

Prior to the execution of a proposed contract for the hotel to be utilized for our Convention it shall be submitted to the International Judge Advocate, for his review and report, at least two months prior to its sub-

mission to the International Board of Directors at a called meeting for a vote on the same. After his review, the International Judge Advocate shall forward a copy of the aforementioned proposed contract and the report thereon to the International Adjutant who shall forward a copy of each to all members of the International Board of Directors at least two (2) weeks prior to the aforementioned called meeting of the International Board of Directors. The proposed contract must be submitted to and approved by the International Board of Directors at least two (2) years prior to the said convention before it can be executed.

I have received several emails from LOH members wishing me well and asking for my address or asking if I need anything. Generally, I'm pretty well off, Janet has been doing a great job of supporting me and the BX here has most of what I need. I appreciate the offers and have only one request. There are many young soldiers and airmen over here that do not have the support network I have back home. Like myself, they have most of what they need, but they don't always get the personal touches I do. Items like snacks, stationary/envelops (letters are free to mail back home), powdered mixes for their water, toiletries, etc. Thank you notes from people back home also lift their spirits.

As a LOH member over here, I think it would be great if the Legion would help support these young men and women. If you care to send something over here, I

will make sure it is placed in the hands of someone who could really use a moral boost. Bagram is one of three main bases in country and there are a lot of folks processing through here to locations that are, to say the least, primitive. There is a USO and a couple of MWR tents set up that could be used to distribute items as well.

And don't forget to send the most important item, membership petitions! We might as well get these young men before the band or clown units get to them.
